WHAT IS A GRASSROOTS DEVELOPMENT PLAN?



A grassroots development plan is the outcome of

- study and analysis of the existing situation regarding grassroots and youth football in the country
- evaluation and consultation with key stakeholders
- an agreed, realistic and effective development strategy

The plan sets out the goals and actions that will drive towards achieving the defined objectives.

STAGES IN DEVELOPMENT OF A GRASSROOTS PLAN



- 1. Study and analysis
- (i) of football throughout the country
- (ii) of playing and training facilities available
- (iii) of the educational system mainly at primary level
- (iv) of sports policies, particularly "youth football"
- (v) of administrative and technical organisation at national, regional and local levels
- (vi) of the availability of coach-educators, training equipment and teaching materials

STAGES IN DEVELOPMENT OF A GRASSROOTS PLAN



2. Evaluation and consultation

- Can a project be launched or a seminar be organised to study the feasibility of the programme?
- Is there an existing grassroots structure in the technical department of the MA?
- Are there sufficient links between the MA and key partners such as the Ministries of Sports, Education and Health?
- Can the vision and objectives of FIFA's grassroots programme be fulfilled?
- What role and involvement can key stakeholders have to ensure the continuity of the project?

PLANNING



- Effective planning needs to be a shared process that involves all stakeholders
- In the case of a grassroots programme it is essential that links and partnership be created with government and other bodies
- The first stage of planning is to understand clearly what you hope to achieve and what actions will help you to reach your objectives
- It is also essential to design an effective monitoring and evaluation system to ensure that the programmes meet the expected outcomes
- Your objectives should be: SMART
 - → **S**pecific
 - → **M**easurable
 - → **A**chievable
 - → **R**ealistic
 - → **T**imed

THE PLANNING PROCESS



- 1. **OBJECTIVE**: what needs to be done?
- 2. **TACTIC**: how do you intend to achieve your objective?
- 3. **TARGET**: what will be achieved?
- 4. **RESPONSIBILITY**: who will make sure this is achieved?
- 5. **TIMESCALE**: when will you complete your objective?
- 6. **FINANCE**: how much it is going to cost?

KEY OBJECTIVES OF GRASSROOTS DEVELOPMENT PLAN



- Increase participation for both boys and girls (6-12 years old)
- Improve the standards of coach-educators and increase the number of training courses for grassroots football
- Encourage teachers, social workers, parents and volunteers to get involved in grassroots activities
- Organise grassroots tournaments and festivals for all age groups
- Improve communication and develop relationships with all stakeholders
- Establish a grassroots structure within the technical department
- Sign agreements and "Memoranda of understanding" with government bodies, primarily the ministries of sports and education, to ensure sustainability of the project in the medium and long term
